Registration: A registration desk will be located in the Richmond Canoe Club Hasler reception next to the Hasler race registration.


Please complete an entry form (one per paddler), read the briefing instructions and sign-on. Collect a number board.





Parking

Parking opens at 08:30. Please follow the signs and instructions from the marshals. Parking arrangements may be altered at short notice if heavy rain precedes the race.



Course

The course is a ten mile there-and-back route. It starts on the west bank of the Thames at the same place as the Hasler races. The start is donated by a union flag.

Proceed upstream to Teddington Lock. Portage the lock (see diagrams). Be careful how you approach the portage point as boats are constantly entering and leaving the lock. The rollers are sometimes quite slippery, so take care.


Continue upstream to the Ravens Ait Island. Paddle up the right hand side and turn in an anticlockwise direction around the marker buoy, and return downstream back to Teddington Lock. Portage the lock paying particular care again, to avoid lock traffic.

Continue downstream to the finish, which is at the same place as the start. The finish is donated by a chequered flag. A whistle will sound when you cross the finish line.

It is wholly the responsibility of the paddler to know the course. Any deviation from the course with result in no time being given. There will be maps, course diagrams, Marshalls, signs and flags to show the course




The start/finish






The course
